Supply of General Patrol and Firearms Body Armour

Summary

The purpose of this report is to seek approval to carry out a tender exercise for the Supply of General Patrol and Firearms Body Armour.

Recommendation/Findings:

The new framework for body armour has now been awarded by BLC and there is a requirement for each Force to carry out a further competition to put in place their own agreement.

It is proposed that a four-year contract is put in place, with the option to extend for up to an additional three, twelve-month periods. The initial four year period is for an estimated value of £1.6m, rising to £2.5m if the full seven years is realised.
