



The information provided in this document highlights all funding that has been awarded by the Police and Crime Commissioner for Northumbria during 2022-23.

Please note that this document will be updated throughout the year if/when further funding is provided.

Funding has been split into the following funding streams which are:

- The Supporting Victims Fund was first launched in 2015 to strengthen the overall offer of support to victims in Northumbria and improves and widens the specialist services available to our most vulnerable and priority victims. Priority victims are those that are entitled to an enhanced support service under the Victims Code of Practice, Victims Charter and the EU Directive for Victims of Crime. The key themes within the Supporting Victims Fund this year are domestic abuse, sexual violence and abuse, young people and child victims, victims of hate crime, victims with mental health needs and victims with other vulnerabilities.
- The Domestic Abuse and Sexual Violence (DA & SV) Community Fund aims to increase the provision of specialist support services for victims of domestic abuse and sexual violence in Northumbria. This funding has been awarded from the Ministry of Justice and spans over three years (2022-25).
- The ISVA and IDVA Fund Round 1 and 2 has a purpose increasing Independent Sexual Violence Adviser (ISVA) and Independent Domestic Violence Advisor (IDVA) provision in Northumbria. ISVAs and IDVAs provide specialist practical and emotional support for victims of sexual violence and domestic abuse they can help a victim with everything they need to become safe and rebuild their life, as well as helping a victim navigate the criminal justice system and working with the different statutory agencies to provide wrap-around support. This funding has been awarded from the Ministry of Justice and spans over three years (2022-25). With this funding, we have been able to increase the overall provision of ISVAs and IDVA support in Northumbria and the specialisms they have. ISVA and IDVA specialisms in Northumbria include children, ethnic minority women, victims with disabilities and LGBTQ+ victims.
- The Male Rape Support Fund aims to increase the provision of high-quality specialist services that provide tailored support for men and boys who have been victims of sexual violence and abuse, including recent and non-historic child sexual abuse.
- Northumbria PCC bid for and was successful in receiving funding from the NHS England Sexual Assault and Abuse (SAAS) Fund to strengthen the provision of services for sexual violence victims in Northumbria. This funding has been granted from January 2023 to March 2024.
- The PCC has received continuation funding from the Home Office for the Children
 Affected by Domestic Abuse (CADA) Fund up until September 2022. The CADA Fund
 was informed by the findings from a service mapping exercise and enhances the
 availability and/or capacity of the following key services for children and young people
 affected by domestic abuse:

- One to one therapeutic support that is trauma-informed, domestic abuse specific and available to younger children (aged 4 years +) as well as older children and young people.
- Group work (for children and young people) that is domestic abuse specific and suitable for children aged 7+ years of age.
- Group-work (for parent and child) which is domestic abuse specific and aims to address the damage a domestic abuser can do to the relationship between the non-offending parent and their child/children
- Following on from the CADA Fund, the Preventing Violence Supporting Children
 (PVSC) Fund aims to support and enhance the provision of therapeutic services for
 children and young people affected by domestic abuse. Funding has been awarded from
 the Home Office for 2.5 years (October 22 March 25) to fund the following:
 - Delivery of 1:1 and group-based therapeutic services for C&YP alongside collaborative work focused on the individual, relational and contextual factors affecting their readiness to engage
 - Delivery of parental engagement interventions focused on enhancing the nonoffending parent's readiness for and ability to support their child's engagement with therapeutic services.
 - Delivery of joint interventions for children and young people and the nonoffending parent, including those that address the impact of domestic abuse on their relationship/attachment
- The ASB Rapid Response Fund aims to prevent and reduce Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) through enabling early intervention and rapid responses to current or emerging ASB issues that have undergone a multi-agency problem solving approach.
- The PCC bid for and was successful in receiving funding from the Home Office's Safer Streets Fund Round 4. This funding aims to make public places safer and feel safer for everyone. The Northumbria region was successful in all four bids submitted the PCC led on three bids, with the fourth being led by Sunderland City Council. The bids focus on Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) on public transport, Women's Safety in Public Places (WSiPP), and rural crime in Northumberland. Funding has been provided until September 2023 to deliver a range of interventions that aim to prevent and respond to crime, change behaviour and improve reporting.
- The Operation Payback Fund is underpinned by money seized from criminals. It
 supports many local projects, services and community groups that strive to improve lives
 in their area and help keep making a positive difference in their neighbourhood often
 repairing the harm caused by crime. Full details of Operation Payback grants can be
