Minyan Avreichim	This funding will go towards the 'Father and Sons Learning Together' initiative which aims to provide meaningful and enriching experiences through educational and recreational activities.	1,000.00
Pelaw Petals	This funding will be used to provide diversionary activities, creative workshops, to strengthen community bonds and encourage intergenerational friendships between different age ranges. They will go to supplies, materials and the expertise of the facilitators to run 5 workshop sessions.	1,000.00
Beaky Blinders	Funds will be used to organise weekly horticultural and outdoor focused activities for isolated, loneliness and vulnerable people in Birtley.	1,000.00
Blaydon detachment, Durham Army Cadet Force	This funding is to be used towards the cost of enrolment and Duke of Edinburgh fees for young people to participate.	500.00

Love Dunston	Continuation of two youth groups which operate two evenings per week. The young people that attend this group are generally not in education, training or employment and were at risk of petty crime, drug and alcohol misuse and were involved in ASB. The funding will fund two youth workers and two support workers and will help to develop and expand the work they are doing in offering positive activities and involvement in meaningful projects as alternatives to ASB and petty crime.	4,440.00
Holding hands Northeast CIC	This funding will be used towards the rising star youth project focused on engaging youths from the Black community through and providing activities to promote Inclusion and positive engagement.	1,000.00
Newcastle east end girls	Funding for this organisation will go towards supplying their girls football team with strips to enable them to be able to participate in match games on a weekly basis.	1,000.00
Newcastle Westgate Juniors U9s	Funding to purchase football kit for young boys to be able to feel part of a team and to keep them warm during the winter nights.	738.00
Northern Edge Sports Limited	Funding for monthly family roller disco nights on a Friday night over 6 months. The funding will be used to cover the cost of the venue hire and also the coaching to be able to run these.	612.00
