#### I. PURPOSE

1.1 The purpose of this report is to set out the capital forecast for 2023/24 as at 30 June 2023.

## 2. RECOMMENDATION

- 2.1 The Police and Crime Commissioner is requested to:
  - a. Note the Capital Monitoring for Qtr. I as at 30 June 2023.

## 3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 The capital programme of £33.376m was approved on 07 March 2023 as part of the MTFS refresh exercise.
- 3.2 The Capital Outturn report for 2022/23 notes slippage of £5.831m, there has also been a reprofiling of programme spend, resulting in adjustments to future years of £12.761m, bringing the capital programme 2023/24 to a revised total of £26.446m.

## **CAPITAL MONITORING 2023/24 – QUARTER I**

- 3.3 As previously reported, the recovery from the pandemic had not been as fast as expected and a number of projects/deliveries remain impacted resulting in the progression of these being pushed into the current or next financial year.
- 3.4 As at Quarter I, most projects have commenced, however some are still at the planning stage and awaiting the outcome of reviews or progressing through the tender process.
- 3.5 The forecast capital outturn and variations to the revised programme, as at 30 June 2023 are set out in the table below:

- 3.6 Details of the capital monitoring variances in **Appendix I** sets out a high-level summary of the key budget areas.
- 3.7 There are three variances to note:
- 3.8 **Building Works** Photovoltaic installations require both planning permission and a tender exercise; both processes are lengthy and spend is unlikely to occur before the end of the financial year.
- 3.9 **Digital Policing and Digital Transformation –** Development of the Archive Data Store has been paused to enable the installation of the new NPICCS servers and will re-start in Quarter 4 2023/2024.
- 3.10 Crown DMS project is being set up with the requirement capture in progress, potentially the project will not be completed this financial year.
- 3.11 **Vehicle and Equipment Body armour refresh -** A new contract is not foreseen to be in place before Oct/Nov, with a 3 to 4 months lead time for any orders placed, it is unlikely that the full budget will be spent by year-end.
- 3.12 The capital programme for 2023/24 will be financed as shown in the table below:

- 3.13 The changes to capital financing are related to the three variances highlighted in 2.6.
- 3.14 The sale of 2 BMW vehicles has resulted in capital receipts of £0.082m; there are no other capital receipts expected in-year. Capital receipts carried forward from previous years amount to £17.271m.
- 3.15 The prudential indicators for capital are set out in **Appendix 2** including liability benchmark. All indicators were within the agreed limits as at 30 June 2023.
