**Title and Reference: NP0295 – Firearms Body Armour  
(PCC/663/2025)**

#### Summary

The purpose of this report is to advise of the outcome from a tender process to let a contract for the supply of Firearms Body Armour for the Force

#### Recommendation/Findings:

It is recommended we award the new contract for the supply of Firearms Body Armour to Safariland who provided the most advantageous tender.

The proposed contract is for 48 months, with the option to extend for a further 3 x 12 months.

The tender sum of £743,280 was based on purchasing more items than required and for evaluation purposes only.

The estimated total value of the contract is £360,000 which consists of an initial outlay of 190 full AFO Armour Systems, along with an approximate annual forecast of 30 additional armour each year. The initial outlay will cost £188,480 and each year following will be a spend of £29,760.
