

The information provided in this document highlights all funding that has been awarded by the Police and Crime Commissioner for Northumbria during 2024-25.

Please note that this document will be updated throughout the year if/when further funding is provided.

Funding has been split into the following funding streams which are:

- The **Supporting Victims Programme (SVP) 2023-2026** strengthens the overall offer of support to victims of crime in Northumbria, builds capacity and maximises potential of the specialist services available to support victims to cope and recover. Our vision is to ensure that victims of crime feel confident to seek help and when they do, they are provided with a choice of high-quality support tailored to meet their individual needs. The key themes within the Supporting Victims Programme are domestic abuse, sexual violence and abuse, young people and child victims, victims of stalking and harassment, victims of hate crime, victims of violent crime (violence against the person), victims with mental health needs and victims with other vulnerabilities (including exploitation). Following sustained campaigning from Northumbria PCC and others, the Ministry of Justice has committed to a multi-year funding settlement which has allowed us to pass on multi-year commitments to our providers.
- The **Domestic Abuse and Sexual Violence (DA & SV) Community Fund** aims to increase the provision of specialist support services for victims of domestic abuse and sexual violence in Northumbria. This funding has been awarded from the Ministry of Justice and spans over three years (2022-25).
- The **ISVA and IDVA Fund Rounds 1, 2, 3 and 4** has a purpose increasing Independent Sexual Violence Adviser (ISVA) and Independent Domestic Violence Advisor (IDVA) provision in Northumbria. ISVAs and IDVAs provide specialist practical and emotional support for victims of sexual violence and domestic abuse – they can help a victim with everything they need to become safe and rebuild their life, as well as helping a victim navigate the criminal justice system and working with the different statutory agencies to provide wrap-around support. This funding has been awarded from the Ministry of Justice and spans over three financial years (2022-25) for Rounds 1 and 2, and 2 financial years (2023-25) for Round 3 and Round 4. With this funding, we have been able to increase the overall provision of ISVAs and IDVA support in Northumbria and the specialisms they have. ISVA and IDVA specialisms in Northumbria include children, ethnic minority women, victims with disabilities and LGBTQ+ victims.
- Northumbria PCC bid for and was successful in receiving funding from the **NHS England Sexual Assault and Abuse (SAAS) Fund** to strengthen the provision of services for sexual violence victims in Northumbria. This funding has been granted from April 2024 to March 2025.
- The **Children Affected by Domestic Abuse (CADA) Fund** aims to support and enhance the provision of therapeutic services for children and young people affected by domestic abuse. Funding has been awarded from the Home Office for 2.5 years (October 22 – March 25) to fund the following:
 - Delivery of 1:1 and group-based therapeutic services for C&YP alongside collaborative work focused on the individual, relational and contextual factors affecting their readiness to engage.

- Delivery of parental engagement interventions focused on enhancing the non-offending parent's readiness for and ability to support their child's engagement with therapeutic services.
 - Delivery of joint interventions for children and young people and the non-offending parent, including those that address the impact of domestic abuse on their relationship/attachment.
- Northumbria was successful in receiving funding from the Home Office for **Domestic Abuse Specialists in Control Rooms (Raneem's Law)**, which runs from January 2025 to July 2025 and is a Government initial scheme to test domestic abuse specialists in 999 controls rooms in relation to a manifesto commitment to 'Raneem's Law'. The domestic abuse specialists use their subject expertise to improve the police response to domestic abuse by, for example, providing advice on risk assessments, providing feedback to call handlers on victim engagement or facilitating referrals to local services.
 - Following the success of Northumbria's Safer Streets Round 4 projects, the PCC is receiving funding from the Home Office's **Safer Streets Fund Round 5**. The projects that are being carried out with this funding build on successes from the previous round and will continue to focus on ASB and women's safety in public places, with the ASB project now focusing on motorcycle ASB as well as ASB on transport. In addition to the ASB and women's safety projects, a new project focused on targeting and reducing ASB deliberate secondary fires is being delivered.
 - The **ASB Rapid Response Fund** aims to prevent and reduce Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) through enabling early intervention and rapid responses to current or emerging ASB issues that have undergone a multi-agency problem solving approach.
 - The **Hotspot Response Fund** and **Immediate Justice Fund** follow on from the Home Office's ASB Trailblazer funding awarded in 2023-24. Further funding has been awarded for the 2024-25 financial year. The Immediate Justice project sees ASB perpetrators repair or make good the damage caused by the offence or uptake up to 20 hours of unpaid work. Hotspot Response delivers a strong, focused approach to deterring and tackling ASB across transport networks as well as in three communities suffering high levels of ASB.
 - The **Operation Payback Fund** is underpinned by money seized from criminals. It supports many local projects, services and community groups that strive to improve lives in their area and help keep making a positive difference in their neighbourhood often repairing the harm caused by crime. **Full details of Operation Payback grants can be found [here](#).**
