

# VAWG PREVENTION EDUCATIONAL RESOURCES IN NORTHUMBRIA

The information provided in this document has been brought together by the Police and Crime Commissioner for Northumbria during 2024-25. It provides details of the current landscape of VAWG educational resources and early intervention work targeted at young people in both education and community settings to prevent perpetration and victimisation under VAWG crime types.

Please note that this document will be updated annually if/when further relevant information is available.

The VAWG crime types considered in this exercise are those with the highest risk and highest harm including Rape and serious sexual offences (RASSO), Domestic Abuse (DA), Child Sexual Exploitation and abuse (CSE/A), Online harms and Stalking and harassment. There is a wide a variety in general approaches that have the potential to reduce violence against women and girls (VAWG) and the marketplace for this area of work is flooded. Some of the interventions listed in this mapping document are not focused on preventing VAWG specifically but include healthy relationship work within their offer. The intervention types fall into four categories which are:

- Supporting men and boys to think critically about sexist ideology that they are exposed to/ Addressing the attitudes and behaviours that underpin violence against women and girls.
- Raising awareness and learning about crimes like domestic abuse, child sexual exploitation, online misogyny, sexual harassment, rape and serious sexual offences and stalking.
- Raise awareness of risk factors and support pathways for victims.
- Programmes of work with young people that include sessions on VAWG prevention related aims.

The information included in this briefing at pages 3 to 14 references the organisations contact details, target key stages (KS2 KS3 KS4 KS5) for each of the inputs and regional coverage, as well as input topics covered and descriptions. The details have been sourced through a non-systematic search of the literature and survey responses from the organisations in our region.

It does not include all available programmes delivered by external organisations, or all national programmes. It also does not intend to present an endorsement of any single programme or formal assessment of its quality. However, we recognise the need to collate information that can be used by key agencies, schools and community organisations who are seeking an understanding of what the landscape in this area of VAWG Prevention work looks like for our region, so that it may be considered within related strategies, initiatives and decision making.

The briefing also includes wider work taking place across the region and UK in this area of VAWG prevention and information for local authority key contacts at pages 15 to 17.

#### **Insights and Resources**

#### **Key Insights**

- 1. Strategic stakeholders in each local authority area are assembling multi-agency working groups to look at the nature of VAWG issues amongst young people and explore needs assessments to start implementing early intervention strategies.
- 2. There are at least 27 organisations offering and actively delivering educational packages that address VAWG in the Northumbria force area.
- 3. Funding varies and flows to this area of work from health, education and statutory agency budgets, 15% rely on short term funding, 27% are free, and 58% of the resources require costs to be covered for delivery or access to resources.
- 4. 5 out of a total of 33 resources identified are designed to support boys to think critically about sexist ideology and address behaviours and attitudes that underpin VAWG - 85% of resources are focused on raising awareness of VAWG crime types and support pathways for victims.
- 5. 57% of organisations identified are local to the region, with others operating across the UK.
- 6. Topics covered by providers in each of the programmes available vary with awareness raising of VAWG and related issues comprising content share:
  - Domestic abuse 63%
  - Stalking and harassment 45%
  - Online harms 39%
  - Child Sexual Exploitation 33%
  - Healthy Relationships 27%
  - Rape and serious sexual offences 27%
  - Misogyny 27%
  - Sexual harassment 12%
  - Extremism 6%
- 7. 1 in 5 organisations identified are by and for VAWG specialist services.
- 8. The majority of inputs are delivered in person by the provider with 15% of the resources available as digital toolkits five out of six are designed for educators to deliver inputs independently, with only one out of six resources is designed as elearning for students (e.g. Northumberland Domestic Abuse Service Digital Toolkit).
- 9. Organisations that have designed and are delivering educational inputs across the region come from the local voluntary community and social enterprise (VCSE) sector (66%), private sector organisations (15%), national campaign groups (15%) and some local health organisations.
- 10. A lack of consistency in RHSE, Early Intervention and VAWG Prevention models makes it challenging to understand what works and whether young people are receiving inconsistent messages across our region. To gain a comprehensive understanding of best practice, partners across agency departments, organisations and sectors must work together towards aligned priorities and outcomes to collaboratively tackle VAWG crimes via education and a public health approach.
